## A BILL

To repeal changes made by health care reform laws to the Medicare exception to the prohibition on certain physician referrals for hospitals, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2       This Act may be cited as the “Patient Access to  
3 Higher Quality Health Care Act of 2017”.

4 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF HEALTH CARE REFORM PROVISIONS**  
5                   **LIMITING MEDICARE EXCEPTION TO THE**  
6                   **PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN PHYSICIAN RE-**  
7                   **FERRALS FOR HOSPITALS.**

8       Sections 6001 and 10601 of the Patient Protection  
9 and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111–148; 124 Stat.  
10 684, 1005) and section 1106 of the Health Care and Edu-  
11 cation Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Public Law 111–152;  
12 124 Stat. 1049) are repealed and the provisions of law  
13 amended by such sections are restored as if such sections  
14 had never been enacted.
